ORDINANCE 94-07

AN ORDINANCE FOR THE CITY OF SAINT PAUL AMENDING THE CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES BY ADDING A SECTION, TO BE NUMBERED CCO 18.12.035 PROVIDING FOR LIGHT CONTROL IN THE ST. PAUL HARBOR.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ST. PAUL:

Section 1. Classification. Section 2 of this ordinance shall become a permanent part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Saint Paul, Alaska.

Section 2. Amendment. Section 18.12, Harbor Rules, of the City Code of Ordinances shall be amended by adding a new section, to be numbered CCO 18.12.035, regulating light in the harbor, and shall be enacted as set forth in the attached document.

Section 3. Severability. As provided in the City Code of Ordinances Chapter I, Section 1.7 Severability, if any portion of this ordinance is subsequently found to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the other parts of this ordinance.

Section 4. Duration. This ordinance shall remain in effect until revised by the City Council in accordance with the procedures set forth in Chapter I, Section 1.8, Amendments to the Code.

Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective immediately following its adoption by the City Council.

- A. No person may operate a vessel or shore-based searchlight or other bright light in a manner that will temporarily blind or interfere with the vision of the operator of any other vessel in the harbor.
- B. No person may operate a searchlight or other blinding light of a vessel not underway in the St. Paul Island Harbor except in an emergency or at the request of the Public Safety Department with the approval of the Harbormaster, in the pursuance of their duties.
- C. No person may operate a searchlight or other high intensity light on a vessel or shore-based plant or operation in such a manner that the safety and privacy of other persons in the immediate Harbor area is disturbed.
- D. All current bright lights must have downward shielding installed and all other future lighting will have downward shielding attached prior to installation.
